PLAY, LIVE, TOBACCO FREE

The Hamilton Skating Club has adopted a tobacco-free guideline in the Spring of 2011.

We recognize that there is ample research demonstrating the health hazards caused by the use of tobacco products, including smoking, smokeless tobacco and breathing second-hand smoke, and understand our responsibility to the participants of our program to model and promote tobacco-free lifestyles.

We stress to skaters, coaches, officials, parents, spectators, and all others involved, the importance of maintaining a tobacco-free environment while working with young people.

The HSC will be making the guideline visible throughout the season using various messages, including logos, banners and encouraging coaches and members to promote active, healthy, tobacco-free lifestyles.

All skating activities, competitions, events, and other performances held at by HSC will be tobacco-free. Tobacco free means no smoking by skaters, coaches/leaders, parents, spectators, and officials on the premises.





SAFETY REMINDERS

Skate Canada Helmet Policy

Skate Canada has mandated that all skaters working on Badge 5 or under is required to wear a CSA approved hockey helmet while on the ice due to insurance reasons. This policy is enforced during all skating activities including competitions, carnival days or any other special on ice activities throughout the season for this level of skater

This includes any skaters who have not completed their Badge 5 who are in Pre-Test.

Skater / Parent Code of Conduct and Ice Etiquette

Please ensure your skater reads the Skater/Parent Code of Conduct and Ice Etiquette at the end of this newsletter. This is included in every session's brochure.

The coaches also ask that you reminder your skater that the "SOLO ARMBAND" is mandatory for all skaters (in a lesson or not). As part of the HSC's Ice Etiquette, soloists (skaters practicing their solo with music) have right of way. The armband is a visual tool to help other skaters know who is practicing their solo's. The armbands are found on the rolling table in front of the music room.

HSC SUMMER SKATING CAMP

All our skaters who attended our 2011 Summer Skating Camp had an amazing and fun time. This was also the 1st year we offered extended care which enabled many skaters who in the past would not have had the opportunity to participate in our day skating schedule. We had skaters from the ages of approximately 6 years of age upwards of 12—14 years of age; and averaging 25 skaters per week. Apart from the obvious skating aspects of skating camp, activities included music (piano, guitar, drums), tiedye, making window stickers, gimp, and much more.

Thank you to Danielle and Kelsey for making summer camp such a success and enjoyable for our skaters.

Ice Etiquette

- 1. Soloists have the right of way.
- 2. Harness has the right of way.
- 3. Lessons have the right of way.
- 4. When skating away from boards/sides, pay attention to oncoming skaters.
- 5. Ensure you get up quickly when you fall.
- 6. Profane language will not be tolerated.
- 7. Be aware of others skaters' music and solo's to avoid getting in their way.

Skater / Parent Code of Conduct

- 1. Represent the Hamilton Skating Club in a respectful and professional manner.
- 2. To strive to create and maintain cooperative relationships with skaters/parents and coaching colleagues for the purpose of ensuring a positive skating environment.
- 3. Non-payment of Club's fees will result in withdrawal of skating privileges.
- 4. No food, gum, candy, or glass containers are permitted on the ice surface. Tobacco / Alcohol/drugs are forbidden at all club activities. Abuse of this will result in expulsion.
- 5. Pushing, tripping, horseplay, intentional interference with other skaters or profanity may result in expulsion of the offending skater. Parents are responsible for the behaviour of their children.
- 6. Everyone MUST leave the ice during a flood, and promptly at the end of each session.
- 7. All HSC Skaters are expected to dress and behave in an appropriate manner that reflects good taste, and good moral attitude.
- 8. Inappropriate and disrespectful behaviour by skates and/or parents to other coaches, other clubs, competitors and officials/judges at practices, competitions or trips/events can result in temporary or permanent suspension from HSC.
- 9. The music room is restricted to skaters, coaches, and scheduled music players only.
- 10. Video or Photography of skaters during practices and simulations is only allowed by the skaters' own coach or parents unless approved by the board of directors.
- 11. There will be no bullying, victimizing, harassing (sexual or otherwise), impersonating, vandalizing, or stealing from another member skater or competitor. Disciplinary actions may include the suspension of a member from club activities or termination from the club.
- 12. All skaters are to display good sportsmanship and encourage all skaters' enjoyment of skating.
- 13. Direct all concerns in writing to the Board of Directors.
